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### the ancient norsemen




 The Norse- (or "North"), men, more commonly known as
 Vikings from the Old Norse
 VikingR, were seafaring
 Northern Germanic peoples.

 They raided, traded, explored, and settled in wide areas of Europe, Asia, and the North Atlantic islands from the late 8th to the mid 11th centuries (700's - 1050 A.C.E.)

### $\mathbf{DRAKKAR} = DRAGON$

- Vikings were master ship builders, sailors and navigators.
- They used longships with long, narrow hulls and shallow drafts.
- Used a combination of oars and sails to navigate independent of the wind.



# viking literature




Vikings were not illiterate.

- Furthark: Viking Runes
- Skaldic Poetry poems written to memorialize or eulogize great deeds, battles, or kings.
- **Sagas** (or *tales*) long stories about great Viking warriors and history
- Eddas long oral poems about the deeds of the gods.

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### FAR AMAY AND LONG AGO





- **Ginnungagap** was the great emptiness before there was a world, or any living things in it.
- Far to the South was the fiery realm of **Muspelheim**, with its long, hot rivers full of poison and vast lakes of fire.
- To the North was the dark and cold realm of **Niflheim**, where icy fountains spewed forth freezing rivers.

# ymir

- Slowly, over millennia, the fiery blasts from Muspelheim began to melt the icy mountains of Niflheim.
- Out of the melting ice, the giant
   Ymir emerged, the first being of the vast Ginnungagap.
- Next to him a cow emerged from the ice who began licking the salt from the ice mountains while Ymir began drinking the cow's milk.



# Birth of the Gods




- The cow licked away entire mountains of ice while **Ymir** grew larger and stronger.
- Slowly, the cow licked the ice from two more beings: **Buri** and his goddess wife.
- They had a son named Bor and his son was named
  Odin, who was to become king of all the Æsir.

## defiance

- Ymir and the other ice giants were cruel and brutal.
- Odin and the other gods could no longer abide the ice giants' evil acts and together the gods rose up and slew the ice giants.




## the earth




- As Ymir fell, his body formed the earth and his flesh became the land.
- Ymir's bones became the mountains and his hair the trees.
- Ymir's blood spilled out in a great flood and created the oceans of the earth.
- Odin and the other gods formed the sky with Ymir's skull and held it up by four dwarves named East, West, North and South.

## YGGORASIL


- Odin gathered sparks from the fiery depths of Muspelheim and created the sun and moon. These he set in the sky.
- As the sun and moon shone over the new world in the Ginnungagap, the ice began to melt and plants and trees began to grow.
- The greatest tree of all was **Yggdrasil**, the World Tree, which grew in the very center of the earth.
- Its roots penetrated into the bottom of creation and its leaves reached the very top of the sky.




### the 9 realms



- The great Ash Tree **Yggdrasill** supported the Universe and its roots connected the 9 realms.
- One root extends to Muspelheim ("World of Fire"), while another root to Niflheim ("World of Ice").
- Another root extended deep into the world of Nifel or (Hel), the land of the dead.
- Yggdrasil's branches reached up to support Asgard, the realm of the gods and Valhalla.

### ASK & EMBLA



- Odin was satisfied with the new world, and named it Midgard: The Middle Land or Middle-earth.
- Odin found two fallen trees, an Ash and an Elm and from these he created the first man and woman.
- Odin breathed life into the beings and gave them reason and feelings, hearing and sight.
- Odin named the man **Ask** and the woman **Embla**.

### REVENGE

- Not everyone was pleased with Odin's work.
- The remaining Ice Giants, angry at Ymir's defeat, wanted revenge against the gods who killed him.
- So, the Ice Giants began carving lines into Yggdrasill. Each line was a human life, filled with twists and turns, beginning with a human's birth and ending with death.
- At the end of each line they made a deep cut to make sure humans would never be as powerful as the gods.



# the tree of life



- These spells were so powerful that not even Odin could do anything to change them.
- Thus Yggdrasil became known as *The Tree of Life* and humans knew death and suffering in the world.





# the All-Father





- Names: Woden, Odin, *The-All Father*, Ygg, Wednesday, Lord of the Gallows...
- In all, Odin had over 200 names.
- Associated with war, battle, victory and death, wisdom, Shamanism, magic, poetry, prophecy, curiosity, and the hunt.
- Odin would ride across the battlefield on his eight legged horse Sleipnir pointing to fallen warriors with his spear Gungnir whom he felt brave and worthy enough to enter Valhalla.

## huginn & muninn




- Woden had two Ravens named Huginn ("thought"), and Muninn ("memory"), who flew all over the world and brought information back to the god.
- For this reason, Ravens were considered wise and sacred by the ancient Norse. They were the "eyes" of The All-Father and it was considered bad luck to harm them.

# the death of odin

- During the final battle during the Ragnarok, Fenrir known as Fenris, The Father of Wolves, will break his chains.
- Odin will battle with Fenrir and by Fenrir the Wolf, Odin The All-Father will be slain.
- Then Odin's son Vidar, the silent god, will come face to face with Fenrir. Vidar will lay his foot on the wolf's lower jaw and with his hands seize the upper jaw and tear Fenrir's gullet in half.



# GEIR DESS



- Names: Geir Ness, Thor the Almighty, Bjorn, Thursday.
- Thor is the Norse god of thunder and lightning, strength, storms, oak trees, hallowing, healing and fertility.
- Thor was the protector of mankind.
- Son of Odin and Jord and one of the most powerful gods.
- The Norse believe that during a thunder storm, Thor rode through the heavens on his chariot pulled by the goats Tanngrisni ("gap-tooth"), and Tanngnost ("tooth grinder"). Lightning flashed wherever he threw his hammer Mjolnir.

## mjolnir






- Thor carried the hammer **Mjolnir** as his weapon.
- The dwarf Sindri created Mjolnir while in a contest with Loki to see who could make the most wonderful and useful items for the Gods and Goddesses of Asgard.
- Mjolnir is depicted as one of the most fearsome weapons, capable of leveling mountains.
- If thrown, the magical hammer would always return to its master, and some myths depict Thor as being the only god strong enough to lift and use the hammer.

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
# the fall of thor




- The last meeting between the world serpent Jormungandr and Thor is predicted to occur at Ragnarok, when Jormungandr will come out of the ocean and poison the sky.
- Thor will kill Jormungandr and then walk <u>nine</u> paces before falling dead, having been poinsoned by the serpent's venom.

# loki





- Half god, half Jotunn (giant).
- Loki is the trickster god and the primary antagonist of many of the Norse myths.
- Loki is a shapeshifter often seen taking the form of a salmon, mare, seal, fly and an elderly woman.
- Loki is the husband to Sigyn and the father of Hel, Fenrir, and the world serpent Jormungandr.

### the binding of Loki

- After his many long and egregious offenses and insults against the gods, Loki was finally capture by Thor.
- For his punishment, Loki was chained to a rock by the entrails of his son Narvi.
- A poisonous serpent had been placed over Loki's head to drip venom into his face and eyes for all eternity.
- Loki's faithful wife Sigyn kept watch over Loki's head catching the poison in a bowl. However, when she left to empty the bowl, the poison would drip into Loki's eyes and he would writhe in pain causing the earth to quake.



# the death of loki

- It is foretold that the Ragnarok will begin when Loki breaks his chains.
- During the final battle of Ragnarok, Loki and Heimdall will slay each other in battle.












- Names: Frey, Freyr, 'God of the World'
- One of the most important gods in the Norse pantheon.
- God of sun and rain, and patron of the bountiful harvests. God of peace.
- Ruler of the elves.
- Frey was called upon to grant a fertile marriage.



## FRİGG



- Names: **Freyja**, Frig, Frigg, Frigga, Queen of Asgard, Queen of the Valkyries, Friday
- Wife of Odin and mother of Baldr.
- The name Friday comes from the Old English Frīġedæġ, meaning "the day of Frigg," and was also associated with the Roman goddess Venus.
- She is the patron of marriage and motherhood and the goddess of fertility.
- Frig is described as having the power of prophecy yet she does not reveal what she knows.
- She will be the first to die at Ragnarok.



## BALDUR




- Names: Baldr, Baldur, Balder, 'The Shining One'.
- God of peace, goodness, innocence and forgiveness.
- Son of Odin and Frigg.
- Most beautiful and beloved of all the gods.
- Killed by Loki with a sprig of mistletoe.





- The golden-haired wife of the god of Thor.
- Goddess of the earth, fertility, family and wedlock.
- Trickster Loki sneaked into her bedroom and lopped off her hair. Thor, furious, threatened to smash Loki unless he managed to replace the hair.
- Loki asked the dwarfs of Ivaldi to spin gold as fine as Sif's hair and imbue it with magic that it will grow on her head.
- Sif's hair represents fields of golden wheat.




## heimdal



- Heimdal posseses the resounding horn Gjallarhorn and keeps watch for the onset of Ragnarok while guarding the entrance to Asgard across rainbow bridge Bifrost.
- Heimdal is described as being "the whitest of all the gods" and has gold teeth.
- Heidal is the son of the Nine Mothers.
- Heimdal possesses foreknowledge, keen eyesight and hearing.
- Heimdal and Loki are foretold to kill one another during the last battle of Ragnarok.

#### TYR



- Son of Odin and Frigg.
- Considered the bravest of Norse gods who can decide the outcome of a battle.
- Often prayed to before battle.
- Tyr had his right hand (his "sword hand"), bitten off by the monstrous wolf Fenrir when the gods try to imprison the wolf.
- Tyr is destined to fall in battle to Garm, the watchdog of Hel, during the Ragnarok.

# hel



- **Hel** is the ruler of Niflheim, the realm of the dead.
- She is the youngest child of the evil god Loki and the giantess Angrboda.
- She is usually described as a horrible hag, half alive and half dead, with a gloomy and grim expression.
- Her face and body are those of a living woman, but her thighs and legs are those of a corpse, mottled and moldering.

## the valkyries

- Valkyrie (from Old Norse Valkyrja), means "chooser of the slain".
- The Valkyries were a host of feamle figures often depicted armored and and winged.
- They decided which soldiers die in battle and which live.
- The Valkyries chose only the most brave and worthy to enter the halls of Valhalla after death.



#### RATATOSKR

Name means "drill-tooth" or "bore-tooth" in Old Norse.

Ratatoskr is a squirrel who runs up and down the world tree Yggdrasil to to carry messages between the unnamed eagle, perched atop Yggdrasil and the wyrm (dragon), Niohoggr, who dwells beneath one of the three roots of the tree.

 Ratataskr is described as being a lying, insulting, mischievous squirrel who likes to make trouble.

## VALDALLA



- A majestic, enormous hall located in Asgard and ruled over by the god Odin.
- Chosen by Odin, half of those who die in combat travel to Valhalla upon death, led by Valkyries.
- In Valhalla, the souls of the dead drink mead and celebrate as they somberly prepare for Ragnarok and to aid Odin in the final battle.

#### the Beginning of the end

- Loki tricks the blind god Hod into murdering his brother Balder.
- The Aesir try to free Balder from Hel, but they are blocked by Loki.
- They gather at a funeral feast to mourn Balder without inviting Loki.

# loki's flyting

- Loki crashes the funeral feast.
- He hurls insults at the Gods, revealing their worst secrets.
- Loki reveals that Fenrir will kill Odin at Ragnarok.
- Thor, late, walks in and threatens to kill Loki.
- Loki runs away, afraid of Thor's strength with Mjollnir.

#### RAGNAROK "The doom of the gods"

- It starts with Fimbulvetr, the "Winter of Winters"; A winter that will last 3 seasons (or years).
- Mankind will begin to fight each other. Brother will fight brother.
- The wolf Skol will finaly devour the sun, and his brother Hati will devour the moon plunging the world into darkness.



• The stars will vanish from the sky.


### the dead shall rise



- The rooster Fjalar will crow to the giants and the golden rooster Gulinkambi will crow at the gods. A third rooster will crow and raise the dead.
- The earth will shudder with earthquakes, and every bond and fetter will burst, freeing the terrible wolf Fenrir and the imprisoned god Loki.
- From the realm of the dead a ship will set sail, and this ship will carry the inhabitants of hell, with Loki as their helmsman.
- The giants will be awoken and will march on Asgard.

### VİGARD


- Heimdall will sound his golden horn, calling the sons of Odin and the heros of Valhalla to the battlefield.
- From all the corners of the world, gods, giants dwarves, demons and elves will ride towards the huge plain of Vigard where the last battle will be fought.



### REBIRTH

- Gods, men, and demons will perish utterly from this earth.
- Midgard will be destroyed.
- And wickedness and misery will no longer exist.
- The world will be reborn and two humans, Lif and Lifthrasir, hidden by Odin in his wisdom and will repopulate the world.
